Academic Publishing: Making strategic choices

3rd November 2017 1.30-3pm, Lecture Theatre, Manor Road Building

As a DPhil student, how do you start thinking strategically about publications? From journal articles to edited book collections : where do you start?

This session will focus on decision making and will cover:

- What academic publishers offer
- The different academic publishing options
- Making informed, strategic choices
- How to submit a book proposal and what to expect from a meeting with an editor.

Research Information

Researchfish Submission Period

The next RCUK Researchfish Submission Period will be taking place between **5th February and 15th March 2018** and as an ESRC-funded student, you will be asked to fill in a submission. Please don't be put off by these rather frightening forms. Further details can be found on the <u>DTP Website</u>.

Applying for funding from Oxford's RCUK Open Access Block Grant

As an RCUK-supported student you can apply to the RCUK Open Access Block Grant to pay an Article Processing Charge (APC) for papers *submitted for publication since 1st April 2013*. Details on how to apply can be found on Oxford's <u>Open Access</u> website.

Keep in mind the following advice from the Open Access team:

- Check first that funds are available. Authors should contact the APC team before submitting article to journal to ask if RCUK OA Block Grant funds are available and journal is funder-compliant (email APC team <u>apc@bodleian.ox.ac.uk</u> mentioning journal title).
- 2. If funds are available, apply for block grant when submitting article to journal *(not at* article acceptance or later) by sending an APC <u>application form</u> to the APC team, to log potential call on funds.

RTSG Claim Forms

The University Finance Office issued a new expenses claim form in May 2017, and will not accept claims submitted on older versions of the form. Please ensure you use the correct form in order to avoid delays in processing of RTSG claims.
